Teen Summer Reading Club


The BC Teen Reading Club kicked off June 13 at the NVDPL. The online-run program encourages teens to get online at www.teenrc.ca and get into a book. The program recommends books by genre, encourages online discussions between youth and authors, and more.

District Art Gallery Opening Reception

The District Art Gallery, presented by the NV Arts Council, at the Lynn Valley Library is a unique art gallery experience. Every three months a new local artist is displayed throughout the Library, adding a new kind of beauty and colour to the walls. To celebrate the start of a new exhibition, the North Vancouver Community Arts Council and the Friends of the NVDPL work together on a free opening reception accompanied by delicious juice and light snacks. Visitors and patrons can discuss the art, mingle, and talk directly with the artists—an exquisite way to activate the Library space on a Saturday afternoon.

Job Skills Clinic Series and Networking Event

Working in partnership with Training Innovations, the Library put on a series of Job Skills clinics to help newcomers and locals develop their professional skills. The Networking with Local Businesses event held on June 17, was attended by 120 people, HR managers from over 8 local businesses, as well as dignitaries MLA Jane Thornthwaite and MLA Ralph Sultan.

Approaching Learning in a Different Way

Children's Library Technician, Jayme Flexhaug, recently commented on an inspiring experience she shared with a young girl and her nanny. After watching the girl lose interest in learning the ABCs on an iPad, she discussed some alternative, multi-faceted learning strategies with the child's nanny. Jayme picked out a book and used some alternative teaching methods to coach the girl through the book. The young girl quickly caught on, took the book home to show her parents her amazing accomplishment, and the nanny vowed to sign the little one up for Summer Reading Club so she could practice her ABCs. Tremendous work by Jayme, illustrating the NVDPL is committed at all levels to working towards supporting our Strategic Framework.

FOSTERING COMMUNITY COLLABORATION

Exceptional programming throughout May and June that highlighted the NVDPL's commitment to foster community collaboration includes a special photography and history series on the local landscape, and the Friends of the Library Book Sale.

A History of Indian arm

Paul Taylor, Librarian at Parkgate Library, recently discussed his appreciation for David Cook's presentation, A History of Indian Arm, which was held May 27. The presentation is an illustrated journey through the cultural and natural history of the local landscape. Paul is supportive of this programming as it is centred on local information and knowledge, and enhanced by the knowledge and expertise of the local audience members. Paul comments that "David Cook encourages participation from attendees, many of whom are local residents, and are 'sponges for new knowledge'." This type of programming opens up the dialogue and room for discussion among community members, fostering a sense of community collaboration.
