Not even a rainy afternoon at Cates Park/Whey-ah-Wichen could stop over 200 little local readers from walking across the stage to receive medals! A big thank you goes out to the Province of BC, Royal Bank of Canada, and the Friends of the North Vancouver District Public Library, for their funding and support of the Summer Reading Club.

Our very own Teen Advisory Group also created their own Teen Summer Reading Club in 2016 which drew in over 100 local teens. And let's not forget the adults! Over 100 people participated in Book a Trip Adult Summer Reading Club Bingo.
