2017 proved to be a remarkable and exciting year of connecting community, sharing knowledge, and inspiring stories at North Vancouver District Public Library.

We collaborated with our community on a wide range of events, like Health and Wellness Month and Library Day at the PNE, forming new relationships and strengthening bonds with community partners.

We expanded community learning by providing new digital resources such as Lynda.com and Mango Languages, hosting training opportunities to build digital literacy skills, and providing almost 1,500 public programs, including author visits, writing workshops, Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs), and more. ### Connecting Community

### **Human Library**

The Library was thrilled to host its first-ever Human Library event in 2017! The program promotes using respectful dialogue to connect with other community members in order to move towards a more shared understanding of one another. "Human books" volunteered to share their diverse life experiences in one-on-one conversations with participants. This Human Library included titles like Unstoppable: A Full Life with Huntington's Disease, Tales from the Blindside, We're All Queer, and more. The Library provided the safe, neutral space for authentic dialogue, and in the end 48 wonderful conversations took place.

### **Welcoming Spaces**

We're serious about connecting with our community! So serious, in fact, that we demolished a wall so we could connect more with visitors. In 2017, the entrance at Lynn Valley Library was redesigned and re-purposed to allow for better access of materials, to improve visitor traffic flow, and to improve the overall experience and service for patrons. The result? A much more open, bright, and friendly atmosphere!

Capilano Library also received some welcome improvements on the 2nd floor. The integration of new furniture has greatly enhanced the atmosphere of the group and silent study areas!



### **Library Day at the PNE**

### Honouring the Anniversary of Vimy Ridge with Hugh Brewster

The Library commemorated the 100th anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge with a series of events for every age, in collaboration with North Vancouver Museum and Archives.

Award-winning military history author, Hugh Brewster, presented a summary of the Battle and connected the historical events to Walter Draycott, a North Vancouver pioneer and historian, who was a topographer at Vimy Ridge and recorded the events in his diary. The event was highly informative and celebrated our local history.

### **Digital Learning**

We're going digital! NVDPL continues to introduce new technologies and resources to help our community build digital literacy skills. In 2017, NVDPL launched two brand-new digital learning platforms! NVDPL cardholders now enjoy FREE access to Lynda.com, a learning platform that provides unlimited access to over 4,000 learning courses in business, technology, and creative skills, as well as Mango Languages, an online language resource that supports the development of conversation skills in over 70 languages.



### We've got a Book Club for That!

Did you know that NVDPL hosts over 11 book clubs from general fiction, to crime, to cooking—chances are there is one that you would enjoy! In 2017, there were 85 book club sessions with almost 800 attendees. Book clubs provide a number of benefits for members: they stimulate social connection and learning, they have the ability to introduce new ideas and new understanding, and they provide a welcome break from the hustle and bustle of everyday life. ### **Summer Reading Club**

Almost 4,000 children took a "Walk on the Wild Side", participating in Summer Reading Club at NVDPL, resulting in another fantastic year of summer reading! One major highlight was the 2nd annual NVDPL Summer Reading Club Medal Ceremony. Children and families turned up in droves to celebrate the completion of the program—even in the pouring rain! 350 excited readers received medals from local notables, including local officials and representatives from reading club sponsor Royal Bank of Canada.

### **PRXchange Awards**

North Vancouver District Public Library is proud to be recognized with two library public relations awards from the American Library Association's PRXchange. Over 100 institutions from across North America submitted 400 entries, and NVDPL won best-in-category awards for the 2015 Annual Report and the Readalikes, which adorn NVDPL shelves and promote a wide variety of authors.

#### **Teen Scene**

The teen scene at NVDPL exploded in 2017 after the introduction of a brand new Teen Engagement Librarian who connected with local youth on a whole new level!

Some of the exciting highlights include the expansion of the Teen Advisory Group (TAG) to all three NVDPL locations, as well as a reinvigoration of teen spaces at Lynn Valley Library with new furniture and a space redesign. Teens helped the Library make informed decisions about teen services and spaces, contributed 163 hours to Book Buddies and Tech Tutors, created custom artwork for the Teen Summer Reading Club, and more. Over all, participation at teen programs tripled in 2017!
