### **Celebrating Children's Indigenous Literature**

NVDPL welcomed community members and local educators to an event dedicated to highlighting the beauty and diversity in children's Indigenous picture books. The event promoted the launch of a brand-new resource called From Sea to Sea to Sea: Celebrating Indigenous Picture Books, a digital catalogue of over 100 books by First Nations, Métis, and Inuit authors and illustrators. The project was initiated by IBBY Canada in response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action. NVDPL staff member Allison Taylor McBride lent her expertise to help curate the list of recommended reads. The end result is a fantastic resource that reflects the diverse First Nations, Métis, and Inuit cultures, languages, perspectives,
